### In Memoriam

It is with grief and sadness that we mourn a chorus member and friend Jim Bretz.

Jim passed away suddenly on July 6 at the age of 58. He is survived by his parents, brothers, sisters, nephews, nieces, and his companion, William H. Hill of

Boston, MA. Jim worked for the State of New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services for 25 years.

Jim began his career as a mental health worker at NH Hospital. When Laconia State School closed, Jim took the lead in developing therapeutic programming and in supporting community integration for many of these individuals.

Jim was also involved in community work and worked with AIDS patients for many years. Volunteering and working to build organizations needed to improve the quality of life for lesbian and gay individuals was a large part of Jim's life. He founded many groups and organizations including Minotaur's Brotherhood Club, NH Political Coalition of Lesbians and Gays, Gay Couples Support Group, Dignity NH, Young People's Support Group, Out and Proud Men's Group, New Hampshire naturally, NH Awards Dinner and the Manchester Performing Arts Association.

Jim was a recipient of the Diversity 2000 Leadership Awards in the category for Community Service.

But I'm Gay And must use restraint in all these things,


So, Mostly I'm Silent.
